- may obey us, and we turn their whole body." (James 3:3) If you can control your words, you can control the rest of your body. • Rudder of a ship. "Look also at ships: although they are so large and are
- driven by fierce winds, they are turned by a very small rudder wherever the pilot desires." (James 3:4) While small, the tongue is powerful and influential. • A wildfire. "And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity. The tongue is so set among our members that it defiles the whole body, and sets on fire the

course of nature; and it is set on fire by hell." (James 3:6) A few careless

words, like a careless spark, can have devastating consequences.
